Preparation work: Pre-course Reading, Research and Tasks

Remember it is also a good idea to make sure you recap and consolidate your GCSE German knowledge as well.

Task 1:

Ensure you practise the grammar seen in GCSE, revising regular and irregular verbs in all tenses learned. For those who want to extend themselves, maybe have a look at preposition groups and direct & indirect objects. Try and put in a 20 minute grammar slot 3 times a week. Keep a log of the grammar you practise.
